

UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

The **National Outreach Programme** is a Global CASE Platinum Award winner and offers up to 140% scholarship.

Every year, **100 merit scholarships** support the studies of top-ranked undergraduate students.

Need-based tuition fee waivers and **interest-free loans** are available to local students with demonstrated financial need.

The **Shahid Hussain Foundation Scholarship** is available for nationals of SAARC member countries.

The **Sekha Scholarship** offers 100% scholarships for the top students from the FSc stream inducted to the Syed Babar Ali School of Science and Engineering.



GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

LUMS provides a **50% tuition fee waiver** to women admitted on high merit at the Suleman Dawood School of Business.

Merit Scholarships, providing partial to full tuition fee waivers, are available to top-ranked graduate applicants.

LUMS is the only institution in Pakistan that offers the **Asian Development Bank-Japan Scholarship Program (ADB-JSP)**, providing individuals from ADB's developing members the chance to pursue an MBA.

The University recognises that PhD scholars have the potential to have a lasting impact on society. All **PhD programmes** at LUMS offer generous funding.

LUMS offers a **partial flat subsidy** to all MS students enrolled in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.

Need-based tuition fee waivers and **interest-free loans** are available to students with demonstrated financial need.

Graduate students also have the option to work as **Research** or **Teaching Assistants**.

From Reading Hawking to *Meeting* Hawking

Dr. Abidi's journey from Abbottabad Public School to immersing himself in the captivating world of cosmology at Cambridge was made possible through the National Outreach Programme (NOP) at LUMS, making him a role model for young Pakistani physicists.

It was Stephen Hawking's best-seller, *A Brief History of Time*, a gift from one of his teachers, that inspired Dr. Abidi's love for science. During his time at Abbottabad Public School, LUMS was never part of the plan. "I never imagined I could ever attend LUMS, as it was beyond my means to afford it." A fateful day, during a session with the NOP team, was where he realised that a degree at LUMS was a possibility.

Encouraged by the NOP team, Dr. Abidi applied to LUMS and became part of the first batch of students at the Syed Babar Ali School of Science and Engineering.

While studying at LUMS, he was selected for an intense, pre-PhD Postgraduate Diploma Programme at the prestigious Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP) to study High Energy Physics. He was later admitted to one of the top physics and mathematics Master's programmes at Cambridge, where he was then accepted for a coveted PhD position. "At

Cambridge I found out that cosmology could be the perfect topic for me to study. Not only would it allow me to study more physics, but I could also learn new skills like computational methods and data analysis. So, I joined the cosmology group at

Cambridge that was doing very interesting work."

At Cambridge, Dr. Abidi had the opportunity to meet Professor Stephen Hawking, whose book had originally made him fall in love with physics.

Empowering Women in STEM

Having earned a fully funded PhD degree from LUMS, Dr. Iman's commitment to scholarship and innovation has positioned her as a valuable asset to the research community.

For her PhD, Dr. Iman took up an innovative challenge to explore a new scientific research area by joining the Biomedical Informatics & Engineering Research Laboratory (BIRL) at LUMS. BIRL offers state-of-the-art research facilities including high performance computing, which has resulted in high quality research at the University.

"While most graduate students worry about making sure they have enough to fund their studies, LUMS offered me every opportunity to learn and grow. I had access to the University's facilities and the resources to excel."

As a result of generous funding, all PhD students at LUMS are provided complete financial support

for the entire duration of the programme.

As she was nearing the completion of her degree, the COVID-19 lockdown was enforced. But that did not derail her education. "During this time, I had remote access to BIRL which helped me continue working on my project without pause."

Dr. Iman's promising work led her to become part of the 2021 cohort of the Syed Babar Ali Research Awards.

Her research focused on the structure-based design of novel multi-target inhibitors for a neurodegenerative disease, Alzheimer's. As the lead for the proteomics team at BIRL, she played a significant role in researching proteins and studying Hepatitis C. Her work has been published in reputable journals such as *Nucleic Acids Research*, *Nature Scientific Reports*, *Medicinal Research Reviews*, and others.

Dr. Iman is co-founder and director at


Pharmaeconomica BV, which is focused on revolutionising drug discovery by integrating high-performance computing and AI for efficient and cost-effective solutions. Currently, the company is working on developing breakthroughs for late-stage Alzheimer's disease treatments.

The Syed Babar Ali Research Awards, sponsored by the Babar Ali Foundation, celebrate and honour PhD students whose work promises far-reaching impact. The awards provide a monthly stipend as well as funds for additional research support.

Building a Campus **for the 21st Century**

Named after the Group's former Chairman, the Yusuf H. Shirazi Complex will serve as a hub of intellectual exchange where faculty and students from across the University can come together and interact.

Mr. Shirazi, a founding member of LUMS, had an illustrious career, and in recognition of his services was awarded the *Sitara-i-Imtiaz* by the Government of Pakistan.

Mr. Ali H. Shirazi, speaking

about his father, at the MoU signing ceremony in September 2022, said, "This project will be a testament to the love he had for LUMS, and his dedication towards promoting education in Pakistan." Mr. Iftikhar H. Shirazi also reiterated the generosity of his father. "He used to say what comes from society, should go back to it. His vision also included stressing on education, especially for women."

Other facilities housed at the Complex include

a 500-seat auditorium, classrooms, discussion and team rooms, student council and students' centre, recording studio, radio station, Makers Lab and exhibition area/gallery, cafeteria and faculty lounge.

LUMS has a strong association with the Atlas Group which has contributed to the National Management Foundation, as well as scholarships for financially disadvantaged students.

This hostel, named 'Three Sisters Hostel' pays homage to the memory of Syeda Mubarik Begum, mother of Founding Pro Chancellor, Syed Babar Ali, and her sisters, Syeda Bibi Begum and Syeda Mehboob Begum. The hostel can accommodate over 500 female students on campus.

At its inauguration ceremony held on July 23, 2022, Mr. Ali said, "Women are key partners in our country's

growth and prosperity. There was a pressing need for additional accommodation for female students and this hostel will allow more women to benefit from a residential education at LUMS. Following their predecessors, female graduates from LUMS will not only play a pivotal role in the private and public sectors but also contribute to gender equality and inclusion in Pakistan."

The Pepsi Dining Centre (PDC) underwent a total revamp funded by PepsiCo; the refurbished facility serves different varieties of food and accommodates at least 660 students, a 37.5% increase in capacity.

To formalise the agreement, an MoU signing ceremony was held at the University. Signatories included Dr. Arshad Ahmad and Mr. Abdul Latif, CEO, Lotte Akhtar Beverages Pvt. Ltd., the execution arm for

the initiative. Mr. Khurram Shahzad, CFO, PepsiCo was also present at the event.

Mr. Shahzad spoke about PepsiCo's relationship with the University. "I treasure our strategic partnership with LUMS over the decades and this agreement is another milestone. The Pepsi Dining Centre is one of the most cherished spots on campus and we are excited to see our plans to embed our PEP+ sustainability vision into the new design of the

facility come to life."

and member of the Constitutional Committee of the International Tennis Federation. Pakistan's national tennis centre, the S. Dilawar Abbas PTF Tennis Complex is named in his honour.

To commemorate the gift, a plaque unveiling ceremony was held at the tennis courts.



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
Thank you, Babar Sahib!

...for reimagining Pakistan's education system



In 1983, Babar Sahib, already a renowned businessman, recognised the shortage of qualified managers in the country. He proposed to establish a world-class university that would attract and retain the highest calibre of students and faculty. Together with a group of founding members, the LUMS story began as a management school that marked new pathways for generations of students.

Over the years, the University has grown to have more disciplines and programmes, but the ethos remains the same: offering



Over the years, to support the NOP, Babar Sahib has also set up various endowment funds in memory of his family members.

In 2008, he went on to establish the **Babar Ali**

Foundation Scholarship at LUMS. The beneficiaries of this scholarship have gone on to drive advancements in both academia and industry through entrepreneurial ventures, research initiatives and professional accomplishments.

Not only does Babar Sahib continue to contribute to these initiatives, but he is also the University's strongest advocate. His

passion has inspired generous contributions from donors around the world, enabling LUMS to ensure that finances never hinder a talented student's aspiration for education.

...for championing women's education

Built in memory of Syed Babar Ali's mother and two sisters, the hostel accommodates 500 female students



A longtime supporter of women's education, Babar Sahib has forwarded opportunities for female scholars through mentorship, scholarships, and infrastructure development.

Safe, secure, and subsidised on-campus housing has played a key role in breaking down geographical borders and making LUMS accessible to female students from across Pakistan. **All six female hostels at LUMS** have been funded by the Babar Ali Foundation. These include Mubarik Hall, Perwin Hall, Henna and Amna Hall, MZMG Hall, Ali Family Hall and Three Sisters Hostel. Lovingly named after significant figures in his

life – from his mother and aunts to his wife, siblings, and grandchildren – the hostels pay homage to those individuals while also providing a nurturing environment for the next generation of scholars.

Scholarships, which are awarded to female students at the graduate and post-graduate levels with an excellent academic record. These need-based scholarships are given to women who specifically show an inclination towards working for the uplift of women.


...for creating an ethos defined by values and merit

From the University's earliest days, Babar Sahib's integrity and values have served as a blueprint for students, staff and faculty alike. His commitment to excellence, merit-based approach, and honesty have been deeply instilled in the LUMS community, values that the institution continues to uphold with pride.

He has also inculcated a culture of giving back to one's community. In 2021, his brainchild, **Give a Day to LUMS (GADTL)** was launched as a successful campaign through which he appealed to alumni to donate as little as one day's income to their alma mater each year so other talented students can have the same opportunities that they had. Now an annual tradition at LUMS, GADTL has significantly impacted student lives. Over three years, it has raised over PKR 100 million from 855 donors, funding the education of numerous brilliant and talented students at LUMS.






From Balochistan, to a thriving banking career

Centres at LUMS

Find out how different transdisciplinary centres are collaborating with industry partners to address the biggest challenges of our time!



The Centre for Water Informatics and Technology (WIT) is helping address water scarcity and food security by installing over 125 soil moisture sensors across Punjab.

These sensors trigger alerts when irrigation is needed by measuring the moisture in the soil using capacitive measurement technology, which allows high precision and durability without hurting soil chemistry.

It is predicted that by 2025, Pakistan will face acute water scarcity. Therefore, such data-driven interventions in smart agriculture and engaging the next generation of water practitioners and academics on innovative technologies are a key step towards mitigating and adapting to climate change. Also, with more than 90% of Pakistan's freshwater resources consumed by the agriculture sector, bringing efficiency in agriculture water consumption is critical to ensure food security and economic stability.

WIT has been working closely with industry and the government on developing technologies to improve irrigation efficiency and introduce sustainable agricultural practices.



These sensors assist farmers in making informed irrigation decisions, allowing them to achieve increased crop yield at reduced irrigation cycles

The LUMS Energy Institute (LEI) is helping the government save billions of rupees in the power sector.

Recognising that the common man in Pakistan has for long faced the brunt of increasing energy costs, LEI developed a radical simulation tool to forecast demand and supply dynamics and evaluate the technical and financial impact. Based on this, a series of policy reports and recommendations were proposed to the federal government and consequently adopted.

These interventions now guarantee an annual saving of \$1 billion in the power

sector per year for at least the next 10 years.

LEI is also responsible for policy recommendations to accelerate production and distribution of electric vehicles that have been adopted by the federal government. The Institute has developed swappable batteries for Pakistan's low-cost, three-wheeled rickshaws and motorcycles. This has already led to increased efficiencies and six spin-off ventures attracting equity investors.

LCE helps innovators transform their ideas into investor-ready business plans

The LUMS Centre for Entrepreneurship (LCE) is enabling a generation of Pakistani problem solvers.

The Centre aims to help develop high-impact, tech-enabled and financially inclusive solutions for the country across several sectors including health, education, agriculture, environment and finance.

The Centre has partnered with several organisations to create impact. One such partnership is with the Bank of Punjab to catalyse the disruption in the financial industry in Pakistan. Through this collaboration, the Digital Experience and

Innovation Centre has been set up, which is dedicated to innovation, at LCE. The Lab will focus on exploration, experimentation, design, and prototyping of innovative digital banking experiences. The Lab shall serve as a real technological laboratory, accelerating the development of new innovative technological concepts that have high value.

The LUMS Learning Institute (LLI) is transforming learning and teaching practices.

The mandate of LLI is to strengthen teaching and learning communities, cultures, and practices at LUMS, and beyond. LLI's focus is on faculty development and bringing students as co-partners through the Pedagogical Partnership Programme.

The Professional Partnerships Programme at LLI was held in collaboration with The Monal Group/Baradari Cafe, where 10 students were taken on board for a paid opportunity.

It provided theoretical as well as professional training and collaboration in areas of the hospitality industry such as customer service, supply chain management, menu design, and legal issues related to hotel/restaurant management, etc.

LLI also offered the Course Design Express Workshop to 18 faculty members of LUMS and the University of Baltistan, Skardu (UoBS). The faculty attended a series of workshops on course

design, facilitated by Dr. Arshad Ahmad, Dr. Launa Gauthier, and Mr. Talha Mahmood. Faculty members from both universities designed 5 new courses around Life and Bio-Sciences, Entrepreneurship, Water Informatics, Green Energy and E-Commerce, which were offered during the experiential learning programme held in Skardu in Summer 2022 and 2023.

LUMSx, a digital learning platform allows learners from Pakistan and beyond to access high-quality online courses.

Generously funded by the Babar Ali Foundation, LUMSx will offer a rich selection of courses, ranging from Pashto and Farsi language lessons to data analytics and neuroscience, as well as health and wellness. The platform also aims to enhance the quality of online education by conducting research on online learning and teaching behaviours. One of LUMSx's pioneering projects

was the development of an Urdu translation of Dr. Barbara Oakley's renowned course, 'Learning How to Learn', which teaches students effective learning strategies.

The expanding list of courses covers domains of teachers' education, language, professional and personal development, data analytics, neuroscience and health and wellness.

At the launch of LUMSx, Founding Pro Chancellor, Syed Babar Ali commended the efforts of the University to launch the initiative. He said, "This platform offers the LUMS community an opportunity to learn beyond the classroom, reaffirming LUMS' goal to not only serve its students but also to reach a much wider audience across Pakistan and beyond."





Narrating a Visual Journey of Sikh Culture and History

Sikh Virsa Pakistan is a project emerging from a year-long multidisciplinary collaboration resulting in a website that makes academic work accessible to the public by resurrecting Sikh-period artifacts in the iconic Lahore Fort's Sikh Gallery through visual data. Sikh Virsa narrates a visual journey of Sikh culture and history, which are often underrepresented aspects of our South Asian heritage.

The project is led by Dr. Nadhra Shahbaz Khan, Associate Professor of Art and Architectural History, and Dr. Murtaza

Taj, Associate Professor of Computer Science. The first website of its kind in the region, it features thoroughly researched artifacts complete with bibliographic references and additional website links with contextual information.

Many artifacts are presented as 3D models photographed by leading professionals and virtual tours to help visitors experience these artifacts in their physical settings.

Saving Lives through Innovative Power Solutions



The designed solution is proposed to be deployed for the most critical use: hospital operation theaters in Gilgit-Baltistan

In Skardu, during the *Learning Without Borders - The Baltistan Experience* programme, a casual conversation with a local revealed that even life-saving procedures come to a standstill in Skardu during electricity outages which last more than 16 hours.

A custom solution has been designed by a team at LUMS, led by Prof. Nauman Zaffar, in collaboration with the University of Baltistan, Skardu, academics, doctors, and well-wishers. This team addressed the challenges of continuity, reliability, and quality of power supply through indigenous solutions.

They designed a low-cost and sustainable alternative using low-voltage lithium batteries. Their solution has ensured that life-saving surgeries are no longer postponed due to lack of power.

Redesigning Cities with Data-driven Policies

Dr. Momin Ayub Uppal, Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering and his team have secured a grant for a project that strives to infuse sustainability to our cities, using technological innovations and data-driven policy making. The grand challenge the project tries to address

is Pakistan's uncontrolled urbanisation that has led to unprecedented issues and challenges.

This project is part of the Centre for Urban Informatics, Technology, and Policy (CITY). By strongly emphasising research, innovation and multidisciplinary

collaboration, CITY at LUMS aims to use informatics, technology, and data analytics to catalyse the development of evidence-based policy design for addressing problems related to urban mobility, urban development, and urban environment and health.




Finding Solutions to Food Insecurity

Droughts tend to cause stress and consequently result in significant losses to crop plants and mitigating this damage is essential for ensuring a sustainable food supply for the increasing global population. LUMS faculty member, Dr. Khurram Bashir and researchers at RIKEN, Japan have discovered a simple way to protect plants from drought stress. They discovered that ethanol is the simple solution. Through application of this inexpensive and widely used chemical, global crop production can be increased and drought tolerance significantly enhanced in *Arabidopsis*, rice, and wheat plants.

This study, 'Ethanol-Mediated Novel Survival Strategy Against Drought Stress in Plants' has received worldwide recognition and has been highlighted in international media such as CNN, Yahoo News, MSN and The Guardian among others.

Developing an Automated Tuberculosis Diagnosis

Tuberculosis (TB) kills approximately 1.6 million people yearly and is among the three top infectious killers. The disease is rising worldwide despite the fact that anti-TB drugs are generally curative. The problem lies in the inefficient detection of this complex disease.

The Technology for People Initiative (TPI) team at LUMS, with the University of California, Davis, have developed a novel technique, which utilises machine learning and artificial intelligence tools to combine radiological, clinical and biomarkers' data to determine the disease severity and its progression.

Current diagnostic tests include smear and culture tests, which have accuracy rates of 40% and 70%, respectively, and can be expensive. The predictive algorithm developed by TPI, based on biomarkers, is 94% accurate. Also, it can test thousands of samples simultaneously as well as identify the strain of TB present in the patient.

Empowering Justice: LUMS and Punjab Prisons Unite to Offer Legal Education to Inmates

LUMS, in partnership with Punjab Prisons, has inked a transformative three-year MoU to bolster criminal justice and legal awareness. Spearheaded by the Shaikh Ahmad Hassan School of Law (SAHSOL) at LUMS, the collaboration focuses on delivering targeted paralegal training to prison inmates, ensuring a comprehensive understanding of their legal rights.

SAHSOL's faculty and students will craft these programmes through Legal Aid Clinics, complemented by Punjab Prisons' establishment of a referral system.

This collaboration aims to primarily reduce jail overcrowding, particularly among under-trial prisoners. It also aims to provide education for convicted inmates to facilitate successful social

reintegration, ensure justice for vulnerable groups, and advance legal education, practical training, and research within Pakistan's criminal justice system. SAHSOL students stand to gain invaluable hands-on exposure to the real-world impact of law on the communities they aspire to serve as future lawyers.

Leading the Charge Towards Sustainable Mobility



The joint project will transform the automotive industry in Pakistan



The Suleman Dawood School of Business (SDSB) at LUMS has kickstarted the groundbreaking 'Electrification - A Step Towards Sustainable Mobility in Pakistan' project.

Supported by the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Collaborative Research Grant from the Higher Education Commission (HEC), Pakistan, this 36-month initiative aims to explore the potential of electric vehicles (EVs) and their supply chains, emphasising the shift from traditional fossil-fuel vehicles to eco-friendly alternatives.

Acknowledging the importance of charging infrastructure, local manufacturing, and battery technology, the project seeks to influence policies, decisions, and industry partnerships. At LUMS, the initiative is being led by Dr. Shakeel Jajja, Principal Investigator and Associate Professor, along with Dr. Raja Usman Khalid, Assistant Professor, and Dr. Syed Zahoor Hassan, Professor Emeritus. This project is poised to shape the future of sustainable mobility in Pakistan's automotive industry.

Empowering Communities through Storytelling

In a pioneering initiative, three MPhil Education Leadership and Management 2023 students—Hui Qui, Anam Masood, and Sara Amjad—have unveiled a transformative resource kit for teachers to deliver engaging storytelling sessions in Qila Derawar, located 130 km south of the city of Bahawalpur.

Rooted in the MCI model—Memorisation, Connect, and Improvise—the team crafted the kit that also includes an instructional video for facilitators.

In partnership with the Children's Literature Festival and *Idara-e-Taleem-o-Agahi*, the students have been tasked with monitoring,

evaluating, and analysing the Digi Kutub Khana (DKK) project which serves as a living learning library. The project aims to integrate values that promote peace and tolerance among children about other residing communities through planned activities. The latest workshop in Qila Derawar was conducted

using a colorful trunk to engage children and creating excitement as the trunk's contents, 127 books on local culture, dictionaries, worksheets, art and craft material, maps, and one tablet, were unveiled. The recorded video lessons, shared later with the facilitators by the three students, empowered the facilitators to replicate engaging sessions, making a meaningful impact beyond Qila Derawar.

Partnerships play a crucial role in facilitating such impactful projects. These collaborations enable the integration of diverse resources, expertise, and innovative approaches, amplifying the reach and effectiveness of educational initiatives.
